THE PHOENIX RISES AGAIN

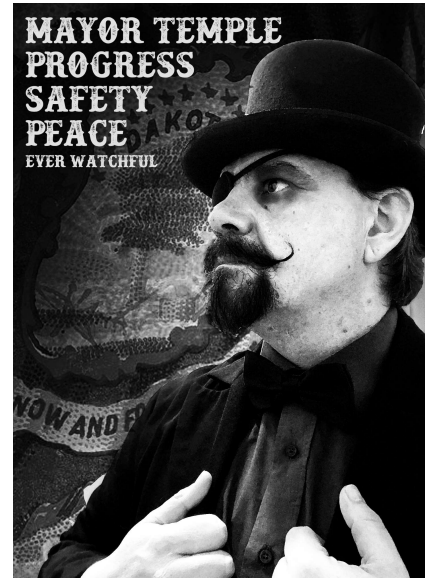
