## A PLAGUE STRIKES THE NATION!

## ARKANSAS MAY BE OVER THE WORST

The Typhus plague is sweeping the United States of America arriving first in towns and cities along the eastern coast is swiftly spread along the new railroads to all corners of these United States.

Reports have indicated that the plague itself is not as virulent as the last great epidemic that swept across the nation eradicating our equestrian friends. Though the government has been swift to introduce limitations on travel to try and slow the spread of infection.

Speaking to several notable doctors in the town of Deadwood and adjacent settlements it seems that Arkansas has weathered the worst of this outbreak.

Government advice is still to burn all bodies that may have died from the disease, and that hallucinations can be part of the symptoms of infection. All citizens are asked to keep their distance where ever possible and follow government mandated advice.

#### TEXAS TO BE INCORPORATED

After tense negotiations it seems that finally a settlement has been made with the Mexican government over the boundaries of the new state of Texas. After what appeared to be a last colonisation attempt by the combined governments of Europe a settlement has been reached to fix the southern and western borders of the state as ratified in a recent meeting of senators from both sides at the town of Deadwood Arkansas. 
#### DEADWOOD ON THE MAP


It seems the small town of Deadwood once again finds herself in the national papers as the historic incorporation of the newly formed state of Texas is ratified in the town. There have been calls within the state legislature consideration to be given to extending the railroad to the town rather than relying on the river and the possibility of Deadwood becoming the new state capitol given its position to the newly incorporated state of Texas. This has caused consternation within the town of Little Rock and concerns have also been raised from Fayettevile and Jonesbro as Deadwood is still seen very much as a parochial border town. Questions have been raised in some circles as to if Deadwood is being artificially elevated due to the wishes of President Lincoln or Secretary of State Kymes both of which have with the town, as does current Senator Rameriez who was quoted thusly "The town of Deadwood is the logical choice, we've fully investigated claims of nepotism and found no evidence to suggest the process was anything but fair and transparent". The small town's ability to provide senior governmental figures cannot be in doubt but is this good reason to elevate to capitol? Whatever happens Deadwood's location will certainly lead importance as a conduit for trade with the state of Texas.


