

DEADWOOD MAYOR DEAD

Dr Jonathan Foster (pictured) one of the most popular mayors in the short history of the town of Deadwood has been killed while protecting the town from Mexican bandits rampaging through the local settlements.

The newly elected Senator Kimes has organised a Wake for the late mayor on Saturday next with a remembrance services at the town church on Sunday morning.


'The Church does not support the actions of these rogue priests, any man who chooses to desert his flock for the promise of greener pastures should consider his faith and look back to his bible for guidance.'


TEQUILA SHORTAGE
