MAYORAL ELECTIONS ANNOUNCED

The newly elected Senator Kimes in a recent visit to the town of Deadwood has confirmed that elections for a new Mayor will take place in August of this year and all local citizens are encouraged to register to vote. This paper is able to confirm the following mayoral candidates with possibly more to follow.

Dr Juan Pacifico (Sponsor - El Scorpion Tequila), Miss Lucretia Sangreal (Spr. - Manka Ranch and Mercantile) and Rev. Samel G. Trowbridge (Spr. - Paxton Aluminium Trading Company) have all announced their intention on running for the position left vacant after the death of previous mayor Dr Jonathan Foster. Current acting mayor, Jubilation T. Cornpone has yet to reveal if he plans to put himself forward in a bid to secure his position as permanent. Registration for candidates will close at the end of July with campaigning through July and August. This reporter for one is looking forward to what appears to be a very narrow race

The Senator has also announced through the Acting Mayor Cornpone that in light of the recent growth of the town a new appointment of Sherriff of Deadwood will be created. This will be a temporary appointment and subject to Senatorial review. All interested parties should submit their interest to the Deadwood Courthouse before the election for review. Final appointment will be made by the newly elected Mayor.

The Wichita Tribe is in disarray after the assassination of one of its elders outside of the town of Deadwood. Many of the tribe are claiming betrayal of the white man and many war bands have split from the main host and have been seen ridding through the frontier territories. Local residents are encouraged to avoid confrontation with these bands and to keep livestock and children indoors.

While the regulators office vehemently denies any wrongdoing the office for Indian affairs have very publicly declared that the regulators were charged with the protection of the Wichita representatives and singularly failed in this task.


The Government in Washington and the Office for Indian Affairs have confirmed that they will be sending expert negotiators and elements of the army to the south west to help resolve the situation.



DISEASE STRIKES DEADWOOD


